#### **THE AVENUE THEATRE** *SITTINGBOURNE*




The Avenue Theatre, Central Avenue, Sittingbourne ME10 4DN

They host a children's drama group on Tuesday after school, and a dance school on Saturday morning.


The theatre is professional standard and can seat 130 people.

ANIMATE ARTS WW1 & WW2 CPD ONLINE




